Pastor's Word

What word do we expect to use for November if not Thanksgiving? I am choosing to use a related word: thankfulness.

When I think of "Thanksgiving" I think of a special time to gather with family and friends for a special meal. I do look forward to this. We have over the years developed a few "traditions" that go along with our celebrating Thanksgiving. One that seems to be growing with the granddaughters is writing on a pumpkin with markers (which is in the center of the dinner table) things they are thankful for. This year we are going to try to use a Styrofoam pumpkin that has been painted with black chalkboard paint. We will use chalk to write what we are thankful for on the pumpkin. I am choosing the word thankfulness because it is from the thankful heart than thanksgiving comes.


