As Christians we celebrate another declaration of independence written with the blood of Christ and sealed with the declaration "It is finished" and the last breath of Jesus. It is freedom from the rule of sin and the penalty of death it bears. To receive Jesus as your Savior is to receive freedom from the rule of sin and the death penalty it brings.
